Learn to machine quilt your representational, painted piece of art. View instructors work and samples. Machine quilting ideas will be discussed and planned before you quilt. Tweaking will happen while you work on your actual piece.

- create depth and dimension in your main painted subject
- quick review of the successful quilt sandwich
- starting and stopping techniques
- · choose threads and needles, tension, etc.
- to block or not to block your quilt
- to border or not to border
- · finishing with a facing or a small binding
- hanging your art work

Leave with notes and a plan for completing your piece. There will be time to get a good start on your representational piece of fabric art with the guidance of the instructor.

Supply List

- a piece of completed, ink painted art work or one near to completion (perhaps started in one of the previous workshops)
- a sewing machine in good working order that is able to drop its feed dogs. Please bring a machine you are familiar with.
- machine quilting or darning foot
- sewing machine manual (check for recommended needle size for machine quilting)
- bring some extra needles in a variety of sizes if possible
- small scissors for snipping threads
- larger scissors for cutting batting, cloth, etc.
- Temporary Quilters Spray (if you have it on hand)
- scraps of fabric and batting to practice on (should be of the same materials as your painted piece)
- good quality thread for machine quilting in colours that compliment your project (think outside the box for colours that might add pizzazz)
- pencil/pen for notes
- cotton fabric for machine quilting and back of the piece
- quilt batting will be needed either cotton or wool preferred
